Shooting at Healy Park

CONCORD, NH – On January 16, 2025 the Concord Police Department received an anonymous tip regarding a shooting that occurred in the area of Healy Park and that the victim was missing. With limited information regarding the shooting or its exact location, Concord Police Department detectives began searching for the victim and following leads to the report of the shooting.

On January 17, 2025 the Concord Police Department was notified that the victim had been located within a tent in Healy Park. The victim was subsequently transported to Concord Hospital with life-threatening injuries, later confirmed to include a gunshot wound to the head.

During the investigation, the Concord Police Department received several anonymous tips regarding details of the incident. A person of interest was identified as:

VINCENT MOTT, AGE 33
CONCORD, NH

On January 20, 2025 the Concord Police Department, with the assistance of the Central New Hampshire Special Operations Unit arrested Vincent Mott on several active arrest warrants unrelated to the shooting. Mott has been held at the Merrimack County House of Corrections since that time.

Following Mott's arrest, detectives from the Concord Police Department continued their investigation, executing search warrants, collecting evidence, and conducting interviews with the victim and witnesses. Based on the results of the investigation, on February 27, 2025, detectives arrested Mott on new charges directly related to the shooting. Mott was charged with the following offenses:

Attempted Murder (Felony)
1st Degree Assault (Felony)
2nd Degree Assault (Felony) x2

“Community Committed”

Reckless Conduct (Felony)
Felonious Use of a Firearm (Felony)
Felon in Possession of Dangerous Weapon (Felony)
Falsify Physical Evidence (Felony)

On February 28, 2025, at 11 a.m., Mott waived his arraignment at the Concord District Court on the above charges. Mott remains in custody at the Merrimack County House of Corrections.
