Welcome from the Chair

The meeting was called to order at 3:00pm by Councilor & Chair Amanda Grady Sexton.

Approval of the Nov 16th, 2025 meeting minutes

Motion made to accept minutes from last meeting. Minutes adopted.

Discussion

Presentation by Deputy Chief Casey and Karen Hills regarding pedestrian and bicycle safety. Slides shared also provided as attached.

Traffic and pedestrian incidents increased immediately after COVID but have begun a decline in last couple years.

Recommendation to propose to City Council that the upcoming Master Plan include a section on Public Safety. Motion made by Councilor Kretovic, seconded by Jessica Eskleland. The motion was withdrawn and discussion will continue at the next meeting.

Chief Chisholm presented about Fire Department response locations and number of calls for the top 25 locations within the City of Concord. Specifically identified are the addresses owned by the State of New Hampshire and number of incidents.

The committee's quorum was lost. General conversation continued without committee action.

The Chief also shared information of a Mutual Aid Balance Card comparing responses by community.

Natch Greyes offered to make a motion at next meeting at which a quorum is present to ask the City's delegation to the NH State Legislature to request additional funding for support by Concord Emergency personnel to state facilities and addresses within Concord as well as to ask Merrimack County for financial support for mutual aid calls to the Merrimack County Nursing Home in Boscawen.

Discussion occurred about the roll PSAB plays in advocating for funding for public safety efforts.

The next meeting will be held on January 15th, 2026. The committee will continue to discuss mutual aid, funding for police and fire calls/responses to facilities operated by the State of NH, and recommendations around the master plan.


