CONCORD, NH – On April 10, 2022 at approximately 1:25 p.m. the Concord Police Department responded to the area of Park St. at N. Main St. to investigate the report of a firearm that was discharged outside of a business. Initial investigation showed that a physical altercation between several subjects occurred. During the altercation one of the subjects discharged a firearm into the air. Based on information obtained at the scene, it was determined that all involved parties were somewhat familiar with each other and that this was not a random incident.

Main St. in Concord is currently open for business and there is no threat of danger to the general public. The Concord Police Department is actively investigating this incident.
